From Pastor Mark

Over the course of the years, as I have grown accustomed to reading and reflecting upon the Scriptures, there are certain passages that have come to be held dear in my heart. Among these are the end of Romans 8 where St. Paul writes

"What then can separate us from the love of God? Can tribulation or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or peril or sword?...No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities, nor things present nor things yet to come, nor power, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all of creation will be able to separate us from the love that God has for us through Jesus Christ, our Lord."

Another favorite is from Philippians 4. St. Paul writes from prison:

"Rejoice in the Lord always! Again I will say, Rejoice! Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Be anxious in nothing, but in everything, by prayer and supplication, together with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

Still another, often shared with loved ones at a graveside, is St. Paul's stirring passage from I Corinthians 15:

"Lo, I tell you a mystery! We shall not all sleep but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet shall sound and the dead shall be raised, imperishable, and we shall be changed. For this perishable nature must put on the imperishable; and this mortal nature must put on immortality. When the perishable puts on the imperishable and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: 'O death, where is thy victory? O death, where is thy sting?' The sting of death is sin and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who has given us the victory, through our Lord, Jesus. Christ."

When I was in High School I memorized the 103rd Psalm, a Psalm of blessing and thanking the Lord for all of his sustaining goodness and for the beauty of his compassion for us: "As a father has compassion on his children, so the Lord has compassion upon those who fear him; for he know our frame; he remembers that we are dust."

These kinds of words, read and reflected upon over the course of time and through a variety of circumstances, have the power, through the Holy Spirit, to inscribe themselves deeply upon the tablet our hearts and inform and inspire us in times of need.

What are some of your favorite passages and verses from the Bible? I suspect many would name the 23rd Palm, John 3:16, John 14:1-6 and many others. How good it is to have these words as companions along life's journey.

Of course, along with passages of Scripture, many of the dear old hymns have wound their way down deeply into my heart. Some of my favorites are: When "Peace, Like a River," "My Hope is Built on Nothing Less," and "How Great Thou Art". Now, with the recent marking of Pentecost and the gift of the Holy Spirit, another one of my favorite hymns comes to mind. I've mentioned it before, in worship, that the words of this hymn sing themselves as a prayer. These words can be sung/prayed by us at any time:

"Spirit of God, descend upon my heart; Wean it from earth, through all its pulses move; Stoop to my weakness, strength to me impart, And make me love you as I ought to love. I ask no dream, no prophet ecstasies, no sudden rending of the veil of clay, no angel visitant, no op'ning skies; But take the dimness of my soul away. Have you not bid me love you, God and King; All, all your own, soul, heart and strength and mind? I see you cross; there teach my heart to cling; Oh, let me seek you and, oh, let me find! Teach me to love you as your angels love, one holy passion filling all my frame; The baptism of the heaven descended dove; My heart an altar and your love the flame."

I am thankful for these precious treasures that live within my soul. They speak to me from time to time. And, in words of Scripture, hymns and worship songs, you can also build up a storehouse of treasured meditations that can enrich your heart and speak to your mind. May God bless you in reading and reflecting and taking into your own personal life and heart those words of inspiration and encouragement that can be a real blessing and source of support and for you as you continue to grow in your Christian faith and life.

Opening Devotions:

Pastor Mark and Council Members opened the meeting with a prayer.

Approval of Minutes:

Members of Council reviewed the minutes from May 19, 2022 Council Meeting. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the meeting minutes from May. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the agenda for July 21, 2022 with amendment for the new business items.

Pastor Mark's Report:

I spent a good week at Confirmation Camp with last year's 7th grade Confirmation Students. St. John has a long standing and valuable relationship with Camp Onomia that goes back for many years and provides a unique in-depth experience for young people to learn about their faith in a group setting with other churches in the beautiful outdoors during the Summertime. We had a great group this year and they represented our church very well.

Vacation Bible School (Day Camp) followed up on Confirmation week this year and was facilitated by four counselors coming down from Camp Onomia for the week. We have had this arrangement with Camp Onomia for many years and they provide a little of the camp experience to our younger kids during our week of Vacation Bible School. Additionally this year, some of our VBS aged children will be attending "VBS on the Farm," a new venture this year, sponsored by the Synod's local Spanish Ministry, "Cristo Obrero," and supported by a number of area churches during the week of August 1 - 5 at the Prairie Oaks Institute, a retreat center located on the old Devine farm on the outskirts of Belle Plaine. In the event of inclement weather, St. John will provide back-up space for the students and helpers to meet.

The Personnel committee has met with and approved a candidate for the position of Worship Choir Director that they have forwarded to the church council for consideration at their July meeting. More on this will be reported in the council's July meeting minutes. In addition, the Personnel committee is in the process of setting up our paid staff's annual reviews. A member of the team, along with the pastor, will be meeting with each staff member for this process.

We are preparing to ramp up our programming year for a busy Fall season once again this year. Sunday School, Connect and Confirmation programs will be starting in September and we are planning on recruiting teachers and helpers, setting up our schedules, approving the year's curriculum, communicating with teachers, kids, families and our staff, etc. Thank you, once again, to the many volunteers who help to make these vital programs happen that touch and shape the lives of so many of our young people and their families.

Thank you to the number of folks who helped us update your contact information and to let us know your interest in helping to serve in our worship service teams. We will be working to set up schedules and integrate helpers into them. After being off for two years during the pandemic this is quite a challenge. Please let us know if you can help in any way.

Regular and ongoing parish and pastoral duties continue apace.

Sue and I enjoyed some time off for a vacation out to the Pacific Northwest. I have always heard that this is a beautiful part of the country and, I must say, it did not disappoint! We had a great time!

<u>Staff Reports:</u> <u>Custodial:</u>

Curt reported the front door locks are now on a timer. The donated televisions have been placed in the center rooms in the basement. He also reported that he worked on the air conditioning in the nursery.

A discussion was had regarding what announcements will be displayed on the monitor in the gathering area and if it would be different from the announcements displayed on the monitor over the elevator in order to determine if a splitter was needed.

<u>Treasurer:</u>

Robin walked through the monthly and quarterly reports highlighting \$10,000 has been spent on maintenance items so far this year such as tree service, gutters, and plumbing repairs.

She reported that the funds (\$43,911.92) from the Employer Retention Credit have been received and answered questions from Council members.

Transfers:

Ongoing Business:

Strategic Planning was tabled at this time.

A brief discussion was had and a motion was made, seconded, and approved to use the Employer Retention Credit to pay off the Foundation Loan. Remaining funds to be applied to the Building Maintenance Fund.

Pastor Mark reported on Fall Restart activities:

The newsletter is once again being sent to Member's mailboxes.

54 Contact Information Sheets have been returned with 25 filling out interest in volunteer positions.

Pastor Mark will reach out to the Small Group/Faith Formation Committee to begin organizing volunteers.

The Building and Grounds Committee presented a list of repairs needed with a cost estimate for the rooftop furnaces. They will continue to gather estimates for the other repairs.

The Mortgage Burning Committee provided an update and a motion was made, seconded, and approved to set the budget at \$5,000. The details of the event will be added to the website, newsletter, monitors, and communicated at services.

New Business:

A request was received from a neighborhood daycare to use the facilities during business hours as an emergency shelter in the case of severe weather. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to permit the use of the building during severe weather.

A request was received from the Belle Plaine Fire Department seeking a donation to support Fire Safety Education. The budget contains a line item supporting the Belle Plaine Fire Department.

A motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Personnel Committee's recommendation of Allison

Vandermark for the position of Worship Choir Director. Allison will be starting in September.

A discussion was had on a service project to outreach to the members who haven't been getting out.

A question was raised and answered on the process to make revisions to policies and procedures that were written in 2017.

Ministry Team Updates:

Stewardship Committee - nothing new to report.

Buildings and Grounds Committee - gathering estimates for needed repairs.

Personnel Committee - met with the candidate for Worship Choir Director. Preparing staff reviews.

Children's Ministry Team - Sarah Leonard is stepping down as leader. The Council extends their many thanks for her work with the team. The team is meeting August 4th at 7 p.m. at the church. The team will be looking for a new team leader as they begin planning for Fall.

Small Group/Faith Formation Committee - nothing new to report.

Worship and Music Committee - nothing new to report.

Technology and Communications Committee - nothing new to report.

Motion was made, seconded, and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:05 p.m. Meeting was adjourned followed by the Lord's prayer.


