# From Pastor Ted

Can you believe it – it is time to talk about the fall at St John!

While it was just one week ago that I was celebrating the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, I have been planning our Confirmation-Connect programming and talking with people about the logistics of making it all happen.

#### Confirmation and Connect

We will be studying Lutheran theology for the entire 2024-2025 Confirmation-Connect year. The Confirmation-Connect curriculum will focus on a uniquely Lutheran understanding of the Christian faith. We will use the Small Catechism to study The Apostle's Creed, the 10 Commandments, The Lord's Prayer, The Sacraments of Baptism and Communion and other topics. A couple of key dates to put on your calendar are:

September 4, 7PM – Small Group Leaders Meeting (Parents – would you please consider leading a small group?)
September 11, 7PM – Parent/Student Orientation
September 18, 6PM – First Wednesday Lesson and Small Group Meeting
I will give you more dates for the calendar at the Leaders Meeting and Orientation.

#### First Communion

Our First Communion Class will be a little different this year but will be held on October 2<sup>nd</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>. First Communion Sunday will be October 14<sup>th</sup>. An alternative service will be on October 30<sup>th</sup>.

Since the Confirmation-Connect curriculum will focus on a Lutheran understanding of the Christian faith, it just so happens that on October  $2^{nd}$  and  $9^{th}$  the large group lessons will be on Communion. So, we will use that as the instruction time and then all the  $5^{th}$  graders and their parents will meet together (during their normal small group time), to cover some more information. So, because of this unique situation, this year First Communion instruction will take place during the normal Wednesday night schedule.

#### Confirmation Sunday

The Confirmation Service will be on Sunday, October  $27^{\text{th}}$  at the 9.15 worship service. The Confirmation Retreat/ Rehearsal will be Saturday, October  $26^{\text{th}}$ . Come early or stay late for individual pictures. We will rehearse the service, have a Q & A session, then have brunch.

In the past, there has been a catered continental brunch for this event. We got some feedback about the cost of the catered meal from parents. We would like to try something new and have 8<sup>th</sup> grade families serve a continental brunch for the 9<sup>th</sup> grade Confirmands and their families on the 26<sup>th</sup>. The church will pay for all the food items and we will be looking for students and parents to serve. Times change, so let's try it. We can always go back to the way it was. We need a few parents to help organize gown measurements and sash night. If we have parents to help, we could have a couple of options for students to get their measurements and make their sash. Amanda Schultz is the contact person, please give her a call if you can help. We could schedule a couple of Wednesday evenings or another day of the week depending on who steps up and when they are able to help.

As we move into the busy summer months with all the holidays, family vacations, VBS, fairs and festivals, we also look ahead to the start of an equally busy start to our church calendar in September. New this fall will be the recording and livestreaming of our 2<sup>nd</sup> service for viewing online instead of our 8 a.m. service. This service features greater attendance with families and Sunday School children. This change will prompt the need for additional volunteers who are interested in helping with the power point presentation of the worship service which will now be at both services on the overhead screen. Those interested simply need to follow along with the worship service and ad-

vance the slides by pressing a key on the keyboard. We hope to have enough volunteers so we can have a rotating schedule including substitutes. A great volunteer opportunity for our high school students. An easy skill to learn for those who have minimal computer expertise.

Asking for volunteer help and support is difficult – we know everyone is busy. But volunteers provide key service to our church, and critical support for our programs. Volunteers are the foundation of who we are – and who we strive to be.



This month's Stewardship article focuses on the volunteers needed for Worship and Youth Education.

The following volunteers are needed for each worship service:

- Communion assistants a team of 3 individuals who assist serving communion and wine with the pastor.
- Lay Reader an individual to deliver first and second readings.
- Greeters 1 or more individuals who welcome members and visitors to services.
- Ushers a team of 5 individuals who distribute bulletins, light the altar candles, ring the bell, collect offering, and direct the congregation to communion.
- Altar Guild -1 or more individuals who prepare the Altar for worship services with flowers, communion wafers, and cups of wine.
- PowerPoint presenter an individual who advances the slide show during worship.
- Live Stream Operator an individual who controls the audio and visual recording of the worship service.

Youth education is broken down by grade with Sunday School comprised of pre-K, 1st - 4 th grade. Connect is for 5 th - 6 th grades, and Confirmation is for 7 th and 8 th grades.

- Sunday School The teachers, prepare and provide a weekly Sunday School lesson. The lesson being taught is determined by a schedule/calendar that is set by the Children's Ministry team. For each lesson there is a binder that has sample lesson plans and ideas for projects. Teachers can use the binder as much as they want to, or they can create something on their own. Class time is about an hour in length with about 15 minutes devoted to a large group music.
- Confirmation and Connect are led by small group leaders who review the lesson presented by the Pastor and answer student questions.
