Merry Christmas to All

From Pastor Mark

We've all been on quite a ride for the past couple of years. Two years ago in December, as I recall, there were some reports of some new type of virus in China that was affecting people. Never having lived through a pandemic before and not knowing how fast these things can travel, many of us saw these reports as minor items in the news. Sue and I took a trip to Florida at the end of January of 2020 and, while there was some greater awareness of this novel coronavirus, it was still in a peripheral kind of way.

And then things accelerated rapidly. I think we were all stunned at the speed with which things changed. We had an Executive Committee meeting on Thursday, March 12, 2020 to discuss some changes we would need to implement in our worship service to accommodate the changing landscape. Two days later, we had an emergency meeting of the Church Council and made the decision to close the doors of the church indefinitely. This was during Lent. We had just had our third Soup and Sandwich Supper and Holden Evening Worship. And suddenly, all at once, everything shut down. It was a weird feeling, like being in suspended animation. Nursing homes and senior residences were closed tight. It was impossible to visit someone in the hospital. Baptisms and Weddings and Funerals were put on hold. We went into isolation. It was a truly strange and unfamiliar landscape that opened up in front of us and we wondered how we were going to navigate through it.

We went online with our services and classes and, for awhile, this was our only real means of connection. We started an outdoor drive in service on Wednesday evenings. We opened for a 9:00 a.m. Sunday service, masked, distanced, with no music, observing all the protocols. Some people came. Many did not.

Vaccines came online in the first part of this year and things began to change. Gradually, things began to open up more. And then the Delta variant came along and it seemed like two steps forward and one step back. We are still living through this new reality, each of us with our own different comfort levels and ways of coping. It's been a long haul and we are all weary.

At the same time, it's also good to put things in perspective. People have lived through tough times before. The flu pandemic of 1918 primarily struck people in their prime between the ages of 25 to 40. Then came a Great Depression, the Dust Bowl and World War II. One hard situation piled onto another. In hindsight, we know the outcome of these difficult situation but, at the time they were living through them, they didn't. They had to live with the uncertainty and anxiety of that. Tom Brokaw wrote a book about this period and called the people who lived through it "The Greatest Generation." Tough, resilient, joining hands and working together, they came through those hard times.

It's an old story. We are working our way through the Bible in Confirmation this year. We're in the Old Testament and recalling that God's people, the Israelites, went through some really tough times. They were delivered from slavery in the land of Egypt and brought into the Promised land where they struggled with hostile neighbors who sought to displace them. The Assyrian empire invaded the Northern Kingdom of Israel in 722 BC and wiped it out. The Southern Kingdom was destroyed by Babylon in 586 BC and the surviving Israelites were plucked off the land and forced into exile in the far away land of Babylon. How is that for tough times! Finally, they were restored to their land, rebuilt, carried on for awhile, only to be wiped out again in 70 AD by the Romans.

People wondered where God was during these hard times. Had God abandoned them? It seemed like it. But behind the scenes, God was still there, working to restore and bring through, even though it didn't always feel that way. Through all of the ups and downs, through all of the joys and challenges, God remained faithful. And, as the Bible is fond of recalling, if God has been faithful to our ancestors in the faith and delivered them through the Red Sea of their hardship, so God will be faithful to us, as well.

Last year we were scratching our heads and wondering what we should do about Christmas. And then, Dan Schmidt called and offered he and Kristin's farm for an outdoor drive-in service. It was a wonderful idea. We took him up on it. We gathered on a cold, clear Christmas Eve. In the quiet bowl of their farm, surrounded by beautiful hills and trees, the air was still. The sky filled with stars. Bonfires were lit in front of the worship area and a few hardy folks sat on hay bales. The rest of the worshipers were sitting in their warm cars, listening to the service as we broadcast it over their radios. It was a lovely time and I recall it fondly.

This year, we are looking at resuming our indoor Christmas services. The choir will be singing and we will be lifting up our voices together as we recall and celebrate the Christmas story in Word and Song. I am looking forward to it!

God doesn't promise us that everything will always be easy. That's not the deal. But God does promise us that he will remain with us through whatever it is we are going through, that he will not abandon us, that he will not forsake us. For we remember that it was on a crisp, cold night in the little town of Bethlehem many years ago that God took on the form of our human flesh and was born as one of us into this dark and broken world. Jesus grew up and reached out into this broken world with healing and hope, restoring sight to the blind, making the lame to walk, healing leprosy and other dread diseases and calling disciples to follow him and carry on his work of healing and hope. He was unfairly and unjustly put to death. But through the offering of his life he provided a way through death for all of us.

This is what we gather around to remember and worship again this year, that God has entered into this dark and broken and sinful world in the person of Jesus to provide light and hope and healing and, ultimately, new life for all of us. In the meantime, we carry on through the ups and downs of life. But we are not traveling alone. We do not travel without hope. For, as the Prophet Isaiah wrote:

"Unto us a Child is Born, Unto us a Son is Given, and the Government will be upon his shoulders - and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace."

Unto us a Child is Born. Hope is kindled. A light shines in the darkness. And that makes all the difference.... Merry Christmas!

November Happenings at St. John

Church Council Minutes of Meeting on October 28, 2021

In attendance: Pr. Mark, Matt Stier, Albert Koepp, Wendy Theis, Rae Fimon, Jen Nagorski, Sue Koenig, Chris Zellman, Steve Kelm, Ben Aust, Chris Schultz, Curt Johnson, Robin Fink.

Meeting called to order at 6:30. Pr. Mark read Bible passage from upcoming Confirmation/Reformation Sunday and gave an opening prayer.

The past month's minutes and the current month's agenda were both approved. (Note to add back-up for Cheryl Johnson to next month's agenda.)

<u>Pastor's Report</u>: "First Communion Class and First Communion Sunday for fifth graders and their families were held on consecutive weekends at the end of September and the beginning of October.

Connect and Confirmation Orientation for students and parents we held September 15. Classes have been in session since then. I am teaching the Confirmation class on the Bible this year. We are planning a fifth through eighth grade service event to Feed My Starving Children.

The ninth grade Confirmands have met and made their sashes for Confirmation Sunday. I have also met individually with each of our twenty-six Confirmands to review their faith statements and Bible verses, along with typing these up for publication in the bulletin on Confirmation Sunday on October 31. We are preparing for a special Saturday morning taking individual and class pictures, rehearsing for Sunday, sharing a Continental Breakfast, hearing from a special speaker and handing out gifts to our students and small group leaders. Sunday morning's 10:30 service is reserved for our Confirmands and their families. Thank you to our students, families and leaders for their participation and cooperation during this past unusual year.

I have met with the local clergy and helped to plan to the Community Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service which will be held this year on Monday, November 22, at 7:00 p.m. at St. John Lutheran church. Participating churches include Our Lady of the Prairie, East and West Union Lutheran Churches, Redeemer Lutheran and First Presbyterian.

New Member Orientation and Welcome Sundays were held on consecutive weekends at the beginning of October.

Regular worship services have been held on Saturday evenings at 6:00 p.m. and on Sunday mornings at 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. with Sunday School meeting in between at 9:15 a.m. The choir has been practicing and is sharing in our Sunday services, as well.

The Nominating Committee will be meeting to recruit members for our church council and other positions, as indicated on the slate of candidates, for submission to the annual meeting in 2022.

The Personnel Committee is pending the hiring of a new choir director. Until that happens, we are grateful to Sheila for her continued work with our choir.

Regular and ongoing pastoral and administrative duties continue as usual. It has been a very busy Fall season."

<u>Staff Reports – Curt Johnson</u>: 1. Curt suggested putting a second front door on a timed lock. Curt may be able to install this himself, which would be fairly inexpensive. 2. Curt is also working with EnerChange, a non-profit organization that is helping us obtain a rebate from Xcel Energy to replace all the tube lighting in the building with LED's. The rebate is \$6 per tube, and the tubes are costing \$4 or less, for him to purchase. 3. After informing the Council that the AA group is unable to financially assist with the installation of gutters and leaf guards, Curt asked the Council if they would approve moving forward with the project at the AA building. The Council made a motion to approve the project if the remainder of the money in the Keep 'Em Dry account (approx. \$650) can be put towards the cost. Seconded and approved. 4. Last month the Council approved the gutter project at the church building. 5. A member of the congregation suggested another TV monitor be added to the Gathering Area, and said they would cover the cost of it. Curt will price out a 70"-80" TV and mounting brackets.

<u>Treasurer's Report – Rae Fimon</u>: Rae presented the monthly and year-to-date financial information for all of the funds as of September 30. This included General, Building, Technology, Youth, Property Improvement, Foundation, and Memorial Funds.

<u>Transfers In</u>: Jim Lange through affirmation of faith; Joanne McConnell transfer from Redeemer Lutheran; Traci Scheer and son, Derek Scheer, transfer from Shepherd of the Lake Lutheran; Rick and Kelsey Schroeder and baby Corwin transfer from Our Savior's Lutheran in Fairfax MN. Council Moved, Seconded and Approved all transfers in.

Ongoing Business:

Strategic Planning - tabled until next month

- Worship Service Times to be discussed further in November after consulting with the Children's Ministry Team
- Loan Repayment motion made, seconded, approved, to pay \$5,000 towards Foundation loan to General Fund. Revisit again next month.
- Council Job Description reviewed job description and the importance of informing the President of upcoming absences.

New Business:

- Cristo Obrero Pr. Mark passed out information and talked about Cristo Obrero's ministry in Shakopee and Chaska. He suggested the Council consider for the 2022 Budget, ending our support of Elisabeth Johnson and moving the annual amount of \$2,000 to Cristo Obrero instead.
- Rental Properties Walk-Through's there has been a recent observation of "lack of care" in the lower level of the parsonage. Kim Meierbachtol suggested that we implement regular "walk-through's" on both properties in order to take note of how our properties are being cared for by our tenants. Council will consider adding quarterly walk-through's to each lease upon renewal this coming spring.
- Weekly Staff Meetings Pr. Mark, Audrey and Rae meet every Wednesday to review the calendar. Once a month, Curt and Cheryl join the Wednesday meeting.
- Camp Onomia / Projects Confirmation students attending camp have a chance to assist with summer day camp the following week at St. John to continue the camp experience. 7th graders have already been informed that camp is a Confirmation Program requirement and attendance is expected the summer following 7th grade.
- Getting Youth More Involved in Church discussion regarding ways to have the youth be more involved in activities at the church. With no readings, and very little ushering to be done, some of the ways in which the youth were involved in the past are no longer viable.

Pastor Mark's Report:

After missing this service last year, due to Covid, it is wonderful to be able to get together again and worship as a community of congregations!

After hosting a cold but wonderful outdoor, drive-in Christmas Eve service last year at Dan and Kristin Schmidt's farm, we are looking to return back indoors this year for our Christmas services. Planning is underway.

Connect and Confirmation classes continue on Wednesday evenings. We are working our way through the Bible this year. We are having a great time as a Confirmation class this year with our students and small group leaders. Recently, our Connect and Confirmation classes combined to do a group service project at Feed My Starving Children in Chanhassen. From 7:00 - 8:45 p.m. we packed over 18,000 meals. I'm always amazed at what can be done when you can focus all of that youthful energy toward a worthy cause!

Regular worship services have continued on Saturday evenings at 6 p.m. and on Sundays at 8:00 and 10:30. We have discussed possibilities of changing our Sunday Schedule with the Children's Team and they have some ideas that we will be discussing together. Monthly services are also on track at the Lutheran Home and Kingsway for our members and any others who would like to attend.


