### From Pastor Ted

Adam and Jean kissed mommy good-bye when she left to go spend a week with her parents in California. As Adam and Jean walked down the corridor of the airport, they got into a profound conversation. Adam said to his little sister, "Do you think mommy will ever come back home again?" Jean quickly responded," I know mommy will come back again because she left her most valuable possessions at home," Adam questioned," well what are her most valuable possessions?' Jean quickly said, "Us."

During the next month, most of us will do everything we can to let our loved ones know that they are our most valuable possessions. Most of us will take time to do special activities with them. We will buy and give them presents. Some of them we will call. Many of us will write letters to or fly ourselves across the country to visit them in person. As Christmas comes closer, most of us, I think, will be intentional about remembering what is most important to us, people.

But what is the most important way to show them? There is something I come back to year after year at Christmas. It is a gift that endures, a gift that transcends all the stages of life. It is the gift of knowing Christ Jesus. 

### Opening Devotions:

Pastor Ted opened up with a passage from Matthew 25: versus 14-30 and a prayer.

### Approval of Minutes:

Members of Council reviewed the minutes from October 9th, 2023 Council Meeting. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the meeting minutes from October. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the agenda for November 13th, 2023 with an amendment to add the presentation of the Annual Budget to New Business.

### Pastor Ted Report:

November Pastors Report

Confirmation Sunday, October 29th went really well I thought. Very positive day with 24 9th graders confirmed. There was one student that did not attend her 8th grade year but wanted to be confirmed. I said she could if she would do independent study to make up the year she skipped - she did attend her 7th grade year. I arranged for her to do 20 lessons in a workbook since we have about 20 lessons per year. After her mom agreed to this arrangement I didn't hear back from them. Other than that, I thought the whole process coming with a brand new pastor on board went great. Amanda (Chris' wife) stepped up and organized several parts of the process. She has some suggestions for changes that I think can be incorporated next year.

Wednesday night confirmation and worship has settled into its routine. From everything I see it is going well and the adult leaders I have heard from think it is a good arrangement. The students will stay in worship the last Wednesday of the month to receive communion rather than go to small group time.

I am thinking about how to do First Communion instruction on Wednesday night. Several 5th graders said they wanted to be able to receive communion and not wait until spring. I was planning to do it then, in the spring. The hold up is that I need to finish worship before joining the 5th graders and then it is kind of late to get anything accomplished on First Communion instruction. We had a funeral in October for John Rickaby. We have 2 baptisms scheduled in the next month. One baptism will be during Wednesday night worship. I visited with one family that is interested in joining St John. They are attending on Wednesday's.

I contacted 3 people by phone that have had medical needs or are on the shut in list. I visited one person at their home who has gone on hospice. I visited another person in hospice at the nursing home. I am conducting a monthly service at Kingsway and stay after to visit, if the residents stay.

The transition interview process is going well. Almost all the November slots filled quickly. I am offering daytime and after work hours options. December dates are now available. It is too early to see trends and themes.

I will be participating in the ecumenical Thanksgiving service next Monday. I am planning to attend the community meal on the 19th.
