From Pastor Mark

The beginning of a new year is often a time when people take stock of their life, looking back at the year that has passed and looking forward to the year that lies ahead. And it is not uncommon that as part of this process people seek to change, to resolve to do something new, to develop a new and healthier pattern for living. People will make these resolutions for different reasons. Some try to do it on their own. Others will reach out for help.

I was browsing through some books in my office the other day and came across the daily meditation booklet "Courage to Change" - (One Day At A Time in Al-Anon). Al-Anon is a partner organization of Alcoholics Anonymous for family members who are living with someone who is an alcoholic. I am pleased that we, at St. John, provide a place in our community for alcoholics, addicts and members of their family to reach out to one another for help, support and recovery. The following is an excerpt from "Courage to Change" for January 1:

"We live in a society of instant gratification: instant coffee, instant breakfast, instant money from our local ready bank machine - it's everywhere we look! No wonder so many of us arrive at Al-Anon's doors looking for the instant answer to all the problems that come from living with and loving an alcoholic.

Recovery is a process. It takes time to regain, reclaim, and recoup all that was lost while we tried on our own to cope with active drinking. Building trust takes time, change takes time, healing old wounds takes time; there are no immediate, ready-made solutions....

We all have dark times in our lives, but the journey to better times is often what makes us happier, stronger people. When we stop expecting instant relief, we may come to believe that where we are today is exactly where we ought to be."

A new year, as I was saying, is often a time for "resolutions to change." Most of these resolutions don't last very long. And, perhaps one reason is, as the meditation above states, change takes time and patience. It takes being honest with ourselves and sometimes we might have to make more than one run at it. It may take the humility of saying that we blew it and we need to try again. Time, patience, persistence, these aren't always easy things to practice.

One of the things I admire about Alcoholics Anonymous and Al-Anon is the simple honesty and courage to face life's brokenness, to admit that we are not perfect, and to reach out to others for a fellowship of support and care. There is a lot of power in that.

Sometimes, folks can think of church as a museum for saints. But it isn't. As the old saying goes, "Nobody's perfect." Or, as the Bible puts it, "All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God." Instead of a museum for saints, I like to think of the church as a hospital for sinners. Because we are all sinners. Each of us struggles with our own brokenness. Each of us has our own issues that we try to deal with. And none of us has it all together.

The beautiful thing is, God loves us, as the old hymn puts it, "Just as I Am." As the Bible puts it, "While we were yet sinners, at the right time, Christ died for us." And so we confess our sins together each Sunday. We turn to God for his mercy and grace. We depend upon the gracious favor of his lovingkindness to understand our hurts and wounds. And we turn to Him for forgiveness and healing.

We gather to hear this assurance in God's Word. We come together to taste and to experience his intimate closeness at the table of his Holy Communion. And we turn to one another as the Body of Christ for fellowship, love and support. Each of us, in Christ, being a wounded healer for others.

And so we come to the beginning of a new year together. What will it bring? What lies ahead? One thing we know, life is a journey, a journey that is best lived by faith and trust and loving support. Christ himself has joined us on this journey. Christ himself walks with us through all of the ups and downs that lie ahead. Christ himself will be with us as we seek to change and continue to grow over time with patience and persistence. And that is good to know. Thank you for your love and support. And may God bless you as we journey together into the coming year!

Pastor Mark shared a passage of the Christmas story from Luke chapter 2 and an opening prayer.

Approval of Minutes:

Members of Council reviewed the minutes from the November 18, 2021 Council Meeting. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the meeting minutes from November. A discussion was had regarding whether an item listed under New Business should be moved to the Old Business. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the agenda as written for December 16, 2021.

Pastor Mark's Report:

We celebrated the annual Community Ecumenical Thanksgiving service this year on Monday, November 22, at 7 p.m. The event was hosted by St. John and participated in by area churches.

Connect and Confirmation Classes have been meeting regularly on Wednesday evenings at the church. We are almost finished going through the story of the Old Testament and will be starting the New Testament soon. Small groups have also met for a Service / Fellowship event. We will be having a Leader meeting at the beginning of the New Year to discuss how the year is going and to make plans for our Lenten Soup and Sandwich suppers which have, traditionally, been hosted by our Confirmation Small groups.

I have met with couples being married in the early part of next year to prepare wedding planning with them. We have also had a number of baptisms as well as funerals recently. I have been meeting with families in preparations for these events.

Regular staff meeting continue weekly with Rae and Audrey to coordinate calendars for the upcoming week and to discuss any needed items of business that we need to be working on. We continue to have our regular monthly all staff meeting which includes Curt and Cheryl. At this meeting we go over the calendar of the upcoming month to make sure that we are all aligned on dates, events and details for upcoming events so we can make sure we are ready for them.

It was wonderful to see the Children's Christmas program return again this year and have so many children and families be a part of the celebration. Many thanks to our Children's team for the excellent job they are doing with our Children's program.

Christmas Eve services are being planned with services at 3:00, 5:00 and 7:00 p.m. The choir will be singing at the 3:00 and 5:00 p.m. services. I look forward to having Christmas Eve back in the Sanctuary again this year as we gather to celebrate the birth of our Savior.

I will be taking the last week of the year off, after Christmas, and have made arrangements for Pr. Diana Hunstad to be on-call for me for any pastoral needs during that time. It is usually a pretty quiet time of the year.

We are transitioning to a new Sunday morning worship schedule through the Christmas and New Year seasons, looking forward to our new 8:00 and 9:15 a.m. schedule beginning on January 9.

Regular and ongoing pastoral and administrative duties continue. There is a lot to communicate and coordinate about in our congregation.
