From Pastor Mark

One thing I often find myself doing when I pray is thanking God for the gift of this day. And I suppose it is a way of reminding myself that my life is not a possession that I own or a project to be completed but that it is a fragile and beautiful and fleeting gift to be savored from a God who loves me. It's easy to forget this. It's easy to take it for granted. And so I need to bring myself back into the awareness of the gift of this moment. As I've heard my friends in A.A. say, "Yesterday is history, tomorrow is a mystery, but today is a gift. That's why it's called the present." I like that.

Along these lines, I'm reminded of a brief devotion on mindful living that Thich Nhat Hanh shares in his book, "Peace is Every Step," called "Washing Dishes." He writes: "To my mind, the idea that doing dishes is unpleasant can occur only when you aren't doing them. Once you are standing in front of the sink with your sleeves rolled up and your hands in the warm water, it is really quite pleasant. I enjoy taking my time with each dish, being fully aware of the dish, the water, and each movement of my hands. I know that if I hurry in order to eat dessert sooner, the time of washing dishes will be unpleasant and not worth living. That would be a pity, for each minute, each second of life is a miracle. The dishes themselves and the fact that I am here washing them are miracles. If I am incapable of washing dishes joyfully, if I want to finish them quickly so I can go and have dessert, I will be equally incapable of enjoying my dessert. With the fork in my hand, I will be thinking about what to do next, and the texture and the flavor of the dessert, together with the pleasure of eating it, will be lost. I will always be dragged into the future, never able to live in the present moment. Each thought, each action in the sunlight of awareness, becomes sacred. In this light, no boundary exists between the sacred and the secular. I must confess it takes me a bit longer to do the dishes, but I live fully in every moment, and I am happy. Washing the dishes is at the same time a means and an end - that is, not only do we do the dishes in order to have clean dishes, we also do the dishes just to do the dishes, to live fully in each moment while washing them."

I was the stage manager in the play, "Our Town," when I was at Augsburg college. The stage manager is a character who helps to narrate the action of the play to the audience. In the first act, two young people, George and Emily, are children and neighbors growing up together in the little town of Grover's Corners, New Hampshire, around the turn of the last century. The second act features George and Emily's marriage. In the third act, Emily has died and is brought to the cemetery where a number of actors are sitting on seats. She sits down next to her mother, who died a few years before. Her brother, Wally, is also seated there, along with a number of other townspeople.

Suddenly, Emily is struck by the realization that she can go back and live a day of her life over again. Her mother advises against it but Emily is too excited. "At least choose an unimportant day," her mother says, "It will be important enough." Emily chooses her thirteenth birthday. She is amazed at how young her mother looks. Every little object seems bright and miraculous. But her mother hurries past her, busy with another day. Finally, Emily says, "Oh, Mama, look at me one minute as though you really saw me. Mama, fourteen years have gone by. I'm dead. You're a grandmother, Mama! Wally's dead, too. His appendix burst on a camping trip to North Conway. We felt just terrible about it - don't you remember? But, just for a moment now we're all together. Mama, just for a moment we're happy. Let's really look at one another!...I can't...I can't go on...It goes so fast. We don't have time to look at each other. I didn't realize. So all that was going on and we never noticed. Take me back - up the hill - to my grave. But first: Wait! One more look. Good-bye, Good-bye world. Good-bye, Grover's Corners...Mama and Papa. Good-bye to clocks ticking...and Mama's sunflowers. And food and coffee. And new ironed dresses and hot baths... and sleeping and waking up. Oh earth, you're too wonderful for anybody to realize you." (Speaking to stage manager) - "Do any human beings ever realize life while they're living it - every, every minute?" (Stage manager replies) No. Saints and poets maybe, they do some."

I've never forgotten the import of that play and it sticks with me to this day. So all this is going on and how often do we stop to be present and notice? How often do we live for the weekend? Thank God it's Friday! But what about the rest of the week? What about the days and moments and breaths and times that slip by? How easy it is to turn around and go, "Where have the last ten years gone?" But how present and mindful have we been to the moments of those passing years? It's too easy to take the days of our life here for granted, as if we had an unlimited supply.

Now I'm starting to get preachy. I guess that's an occupational hazard. And I can't say that I certainly have learned how to fully appreciate the gift that life is, to savor the experience of this moment of life while I am living it, to be thankful to God for the miracle of life, to fully inhabit this moment of experience. Still, I try to be mindful of it. I try to remind myself that during this brief and fragile and beautiful gift of life I want to be awake to embracing and experiencing it while it is happening.

People say, "If I could just win the lottery, then I'd be happy." But, if you consider the fact that in order for you to be here, and not someone else, the right people of your ancestors had to get together at just the right time all the way back through the generations, you have already won something much better than the lottery. You get

to be here. You get to see the light and breath the air and smell the fragrance and taste the texture and live and love and learn and reach out and embrace this wonderful gift. Wow! That's pretty amazing.

Thanks be to God, who gives us this gift, who has given us himself, and who gives us to each other to share this precious journey. Sit up, look around, feel this breath of air filling your lungs, this beat of your heart nourishing your body with blood, hear the sounds of life around you, and allow yourself the simple gratitude of being here and inhabiting this moment in time. Life is a gift. Enjoy it. Share it. Savor it. Give it away.

Pastor Mark shared opening devotions from John 3:16.

Approval of Minutes:

Members of Council reviewed the minutes from the April 15, 2021 Council Meeting. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the meeting minutes from March. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the agenda for May 20, 2021.

Pastor Mark's Report:

According to our council policy of following MDH guidelines, we have made some modifications to our worship services and people are beginning to come back. Our Saturday evening services are transitioning for the Summer to Wednesday evenings, beginning on June 2 at 6 p.m. We are also conducting personal and group service and communion opportunities at the Lutheran Home and Kingsway.

The wheel of life keeps turning and we have had a significant number of baptisms and funerals lately. Weddings are in the offing, as well, and are being planned and prepared for. We also added some new members recently per our orientation and welcome Sundays.

A High School Graduation Recognition Sunday is planned for May 23. Invites have been sent out to Grads and their families. Grads will receive a card of congratulations from the church, as well as a quilt from our quilting group. God's blessings to them as they celebrate this milestone and make plans for their future.

The Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly was held virtually by Zoom this year on April 23-24. Delegates from St. John this year included Sue Steinhagen, Brent Koepp and Amy Franck.

The first part of the year giving statements are being mailed out to all members, along with a cover letter from Sue Steinhagen, the chair of our last capital appeal, encouraging members to continue to support both our Building and General Funds.

The Personnel Committee has forwarded two policies to the council for consideration. They are an "Employee Grievance Policy and Sheets" and a "Discipline Policy." The Team is also recommending a candidate for the council's consideration.

Connect and Confirmation have come to the end of a challenging year. Much thanks to leader, volunteers, students and families. Camp weeks will be beginning for 7 and 8 graders in June and July. A Mission Trip is scheduled for June.

The Children's Team is looking to recruit new members as they will begin planning for what hopes to be a normal return to Sunday School in the Fall.

We have interviewed two consulting candidates to lead us through a process of Strategic Planning in the congregation. Proposals, timelines and pricing have also been forwarded to the council for consideration.

Regular staff meetings for communication and coordination are scheduled for Tuesdays at 12:30 p.m. Weekly and monthly items continue on a regular basis.

I have just returned from a few days away with friends. This is a busy church and self care and time away are important. I'd like to continue the "Solo Sunday" policy we had when Pr. Sarah was here. I will have to line up Sunday and On-Call people.


