#### From Pastor Mark

How did you get to be a Christian? It doesn't happen in a vacuum. Someone helped you. Someone shared their faith with you. God reached out to you through another person. Who is that person for you? Perhaps it was a number of people.

A few people come to mind for me. I like to tell parents having children baptized that, along with providing their child food, clothing, home and all the necessities of raising a child, they are also the number one spiritual influence in their child's life. My parents took that seriously. They not only prayed for me but also prayed with me. They were models to me of a regular life of prayer. And, along with nightly prayers, they shared Bible stories with me. I still have my old "Eerdmann's Bible Story Book" on the shelf here at my office. The inscription on the inside cover, in my Dad's handwriting, says, "Purchased for Mark Steven Johnson on the day of his birth, January 28, 1957, by his parents." And I remember both of my parents taking turns reading through that Bible Story book with me. The pictures were great and I still remember them from being just a little child. My favorite Bible character as a little boy was Samson because he was so miraculously strong, a pretty cool feature when you are a little boy! I was impressed!

Along with my parents, another person that comes to mind for me is my fourth grade Sunday School teacher. Our class met in the sanctuary under the over-flow section in a ring of folding chairs. I remember that year we learned the apostles' creed and had to recite it. And I remember the kindness of my teacher and how she took an interest in me. I'm sure that she didn't know it at the time but she was making an impression on me that I still remember and appreciate to this day. As I think about this, I am also thankful for the many people who are involved with your young folks here at the church in a variety of ways, often times behind the scenes. Your caring and sharing with these young people is a special thing.

Sometimes we can think that to really share our faith we need to do something special like being a missionary or that we have to have some kind of special knowledge or training. However, if you think about it, most of the influential people that make the most impact in our life are close to home - parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, teachers, friends - ordinary folks in ordinary ways who love us and reach out to us and care about us and what is going on in our lives and model and share a life of faith with us that has come to mold and shape who we are today. Thank God for these dear people.

So, to return to my original question, take a minute and think of the people who helped to mold and shape your life as a Christian person. Who are they? How did they share with you? And, as you take some time to think about this, offer up a prayer of thanks to God for these people who have touched your life, through whom God has worked. They are a blessing.

And then, to turn the question a little, who's life have you touched? Chances are that you probably aren't even aware of all of the times you have said or done something or shared in some way with another person that has made a difference in their lives. We plant seeds and God is the one who causes the growth. But we are all part of the process. God chooses to work in us and with us and through us. And that is amazing.

# Pastor Mark's Report:

As the Calendar rolls around into May, we have been in the process of wrapping up a number of our seasonal programs. Sunday School ended the year with a special Sunday on April 23, featuring at our 9:15 a.m. service a recognition and thanks for all of our teachers, leaders and helpers for our education programs (including cards with a gift card), a noisy offering and children's sermon, and a celebration party with treats in the Gathering Area. I can't say enough thanks to all of our leaders, children and families for another great year together! I appreciate all of you so very much!

As per my last council report in April, I mentioned that our plans for a VBS on the Farm this Summer unexpectedly fell through because of some unresolved issues between Cristo Obrero and the host site of Prairie Oaks Institute. I expect that those issues will be worked through but not in time for this Summer. In any case, our Children's Ministry team is meeting early in May to discuss an alternative consisting of a couple of family nights that they will be planning and promoting. Thanks to them for their flexibility and also for their great care and leadership this past year with our younger children and their families!

Following Holy Week and Easter, we held a semi-annual leaders meeting on April 12 with our Connect and Confirmation leaders to review the past year and to look ahead to next Fall. Once again, our Confirmation small groups, leaders and families treated the whole congregation to a wonderful Soup & Sandwich time during Lent. Thank you, again, for hosting such a big and special time together for the whole congregation!

Our 5-6 grade Connect program had their last class session on April 19 and our 7-8 grade Confirmation program had a last session on April 26, featuring a "Jeopardy" style year end review. Our confirmands get pretty loud and competitive and it's fun and a good way to review and wrap up the year together.

Over the Summer, I will be communicating and working with the leaders of the programs mentioned above so that we have programs, schedules and leaders all lined up for when these programs will begin again in the Fall.

Our worship choir had their last Sunday of the season on April 30, featuring two lovely songs, one during the service and the other to close the service on a special note of blessing. They had a great year and a

big thank you to our Director, Allison Vandermark, our Accompanist, Sheila Schmidt, and to all our choir members. You add a lot to our worship time together!

My regular weekly and monthly duties continue apace. This involves some considerable and necessary behind the scenes time involving study and preparation, communication and coordination with various entities within the church - i.e. staff, council, leaders, volunteer groups and the congregation, visitation of people at home, special residence or hospital with prayer and communion, Lutheran home and Kingsway communion services, communicating and planning for pastoral acts like baptisms, funerals and weddings, involvement with Synod and conference gatherings, local clergy, and city and county officials (see last month's report item on "tiny houses"), etc.

I attended our Annual Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly on the weekend of April 29-30 with our St. John delegates, Tim Moonen, Havyn Moonen, Beth Beuch and Amy Franck. An opening worship was held Friday evening at St. Andrew Lutheran in Eden Prairie, followed by a daylong session at Lord of Life Lutheran in Ramsey. One highlight was the excellent speaker we had this year, the Rev. Dr. Otis Moss III, pastor at Holy Trinity United Church of Christ in Chicago. Very inspiring!

Invites are being sent out to all of St. John's graduating high school seniors for a special recognition Sunday that will be held at our 9 a.m. service on Sunday, May 21. We will have an opportunity to hear our graduates' plans, pray for them, and bless them on their way with a special gift, a quilt made by our quilters. I love that! A bit of warmth from their home church to wrap themselves up in from time to time as they live their way into their future. Congratulations graduates! And thank you, quilters!

Sunday, April 30, we began one worship service on Sundays at 9 a.m. that will continue to Fall. After our 9 a.m. service on April 30th, we had coffee and conversation with Craig Pederson, the Assistant to the Bishop that will be working with St. John through the upcoming Call process. I will be retiring as pastor at St. John on September 10. Craig shared information and answered questions. It was good to have him here

I want to say a special thank you to our long time Custodian and Maintenance person, Curt and Cheryl Johnson, as they retire on June 1 from 29 years of outstanding service here at St. John. They have been a pleasure to work with! And thank you to the group that will be hosting the retirement celebration party for them on Sunday, May 7, at 10 a.m. Richly deserved!

Sue and I will be taking a road trip at the end of this month and into June. An old friend of Sue's is getting married on May 26th in Portland and I'll be officiating at the wedding. We're driving out, spending some time, and then continuing on down the west coast and then back across the country, seeing the sights and enjoying some time together. I'm looking forward to it! I have also made arrangements during this time for retired ELCA pastor Diana Hunstad to be on-call for me and to fill in for worship services. With just one pastor here at the time, Diana has been doing this for me for awhile now and she does a great job!
