2024 Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly- May 2-4

With Glad and Generous Hearts

New Bishop- Pastor Jen Nagel

The Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly began with an inspiring Worship service on Thursday evening with over 450 pastors, deacons, youth, and adult delegates present at Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Ramsey, Minnesota. The primary focus of the Assembly was the election of a new Bishop as well as reflection and recognition of Bishop Ann Svennungsen's 12 years of service. The final Nominating ballot of candidates was completed. Biographies of each were available to review.

Friday was a full day including Bible Study, music, displays of resources, networking, and voting 3 different times to narrow down the slate of candidates to 3 for Bishop. Before each vote, there was a question-and-answer period for each candidate. We voted on other Synod positions. There was a Vice President & Treasurer's report, Peacemaking Resolution, Budget Resolutions, and a Celebration for Bishop Ann's service Resolution. A churchwide report and video were provided showcasing accomplishments. Pastors from Nigeria missionary church we support were present and recognized. There was a dinner and farewell celebration for Pastor Ann.

On Saturday morning, Pastor Jen Nagel was voted to become our new Bishop for the next 6 years and will be installed this coming September. The bishop-elect has served as lead pastor of University Lutheran Church of Hope in Minneapolis since 2015. Previously she served as pastor of Salem English Lutheran Church in Minneapolis (2003 to 2015) and as a teaching staff coordinator at Holden Village, Chelan, Wash. (2011). Pastor Nagel earned her Bachelor of Arts in religion and classics from Concordia College, Moorhead, Minn., in 1994; a certificate of studies from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (LSTC) in 1999; and a Master of Divinity from the University of Chicago Divinity School in 1998.
