From Your Pastor

I have made friends with a little bush outside of my office window. Last Summer, as I was gazing out the window, a little leafy face seemed to be smiling at me from the top of a stalk. And when the wind blew it back and forth it looked like it was waving to me. And as I immersed myself in my work, I would occasionally look up and, as my eye wandered out the window, there was my dear, little friend, still there, still smiling, still waving.

Summer passed into Fall and my little friend lost his full green luster and faded into a dark brown, still clinging to the top of the bush, waving at me as the cold wind blew. Fall passed into Winter and the little fellow was about the last leaf to fall from the bush, just the stalk now, keeping it's place. And now, as the bare, white Winter subsides and the greening of Spring begins to warm the air, I look forward to seeing my little friend reappearing once again.

The creation itself calls forth the glory of God. There is a parable of death and resurrection woven right into the fabric of the world around us. From what has been cold and dead and barren, a shoot of new life begins to stir and grow and reach up and out toward the warm face of the sun.

Someone recently asked me about what "the fear of the Lord" meant. Did it mean that we should be afraid of God? And I said that, instead of that sense, I think it means more like being in awe of God. The word "awe" has been devalued in our usage of it. We say, "This cereal is awesome!" Well, no, it isn't. What you mean is that you like the cereal, but the cereal is certainly not awesome.

Awe is more the feeling that I had when I stood on the brink of Niagara Falls and there, right beneath my feet, millions of gallons of water roared ceaselessly over the precipice and thundered down into the canyon below me. The very air itself seemed to shake with the power of it. And in the presence of something so vast and overwhelming, I felt how small and insignificant I was. I was filled with a respectful fear in the presence of something so truly awe-some.

It's the feeling you get if you are out in a lonely place, far from any light pollution, and you look up into the clear night and behold the vast canopy of the starry universe above you, the billions stars and galaxies floating in an infinity of space. And you allow the vastness of it to sink in to you. And in the presence of something so overwhelming, you feel your smallness and are overcome with a sense of awe.

And yet, Niagara Falls and the infinite expanse of the starry universe are just the fingerprints of God. They are creaturely things. God is the creator. And so in the presence of God, we rightly recognize our place, are filled with a holy fear, hushed to a reverent silence, bowed down with a deep and abiding sense of awe.

Martin Luther begins each of his explanations in the Small Catechism with the phrase, "We are to fear and love God, so that we..." So that we obey and do what is right. At the funeral of a father, I remember a family member saying, "My Dad never had to say a harsh word to us. All he had to do was give us a look. We respected him so much that we didn't want to do wrong by him." And if a human parent can inspire that kind of reverent respect, how much more in the presence of the Father of us all are we overcome with a holy fear to give offense.

True are the words of the hymn writer who penned: "Immortal, invisible, God only wise - In light inaccessible, hid from our eyes - Most blessed, most glorious, the ancient of days - almighty, victorious, thy great name we praise." So it was that, when catching a veiled glimpse of God, the great prophets of old fell to the ground, unable to stand, and proclaimed themselves unworthy to be in the presence of such divine transcendence. They were overcome with a holy and reverent fear and awe. So, before we get too chummy and begin to take God for granted, it's good to remember who God really is. And when we do, we can't help but be overwhelmed.

And yet, remarkably, it is this very powerful and transcendent God who has deigned to come down here and be born as a tiny, vulnerable, human baby in the person of Jesus. It is this very God who reaches out to us with love and compassion. And incredibly, it is this very God who allowed himself to be nailed to a cross for our sake. And more remarkably, it is this very God who invites us to reach out to him, to trust him, to love him, to serve him. How can we not but be filled with gratitude and awe when we contemplate such as this?

"Oh, the depths of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God!" writes St. Paul. "How unsearchable are his judgments and how inscrutable his ways! Who has known the mind of the Lord? Or who has been his counselor? Or who has given a gift to God that God should repay him? For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen."

And yet, it is this very God who also, in the words of an old hymn, "paints the wayside flower." It is this God, who creates all things, and yet is so attentive to the smallest beautiful detail. It is this God, who offers my little bush friend to me as a token for gratitude and enjoyment.

How vast and wondrous is this world. And how small and lovely, too. And how amazing that it's author takes on flesh and walks in our shoes. And how astonishing it is that he should care for us. And should care that we care for each other. Life is full of wonder. God is good. Enjoy the warm and greening Spring. Love God. Love others. To God be the glory, both now and forever...

Opening Devotions:

Pastor Mark opened the meeting with a passage from Romans 8 and a prayer.

Guest Speaker

Mark Halla with The Outpost Center, a nondenominational ministry that is building tiny homes and also training people in construction presented the opportunity for the faith community to provide some hands-on support for the affordable housing opportunity in our community.

Approval of Minutes:

Members of Council reviewed the minutes from March 13, 2023 Council Meeting. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the meeting minutes from March. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the agenda for April 10, 2023.

Pastor Mark's Report:

Our Midweek Lenten Services on Wednesday evenings have wrapped up and I would like to thank Andrea Adelmann for coordinating and our Confirmation small groups, leaders and families for serving our Soup and Sandwich Suppers. It was a great time to see the Gathering Area filled with food and fellowship each week. Also, thanks to our Cantors for our Holden Evening Prayer Service and to our Speakers who shared a witness of their faith with us each week. One young person said to me that we should have Soup & Sandwich and Worship every Wednesday evening! Sounds like he enjoyed it as much as I did.

As I write this, I have been preparing the worship services and homilies for our special Holy Week services on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter. The great events of this week serve as the foundation of our faith and I am looking forward to being with our church community as we gather together in worship.

Connect and Confirmation classes will be resuming after Lent and will be finishing up the current year. Part of this will also involve a special meeting with our program leaders to look back and assess the year we have had together. Along with that, we will also be looking forward to preparations for the coming year.

We welcomed four new families into our congregation as new members during our recent orientation and welcome Sundays.

I have been in contact with our Children's ministry team in planning for an end of the year celebration for Sunday School that will be coming up toward the end of the month. In addition, we are also pondering Vacation Bible School. Surprisingly, the arrangement between Cristo Obrero and the Prairie Oaks Institute fell apart and so we will not be able to have "VBS on the Farm," as we were planning. Other ideas, perhaps in collaboration with other congregations, are currently taking place. There will be more forthcoming on this as things develop.

At our last Belle Plaine Affordable Housing meeting that I attended at City Hall, an idea came up for affordable housing that involves St. John. I followed up by sending an e-mail to our council about inviting one of the participants, Mark Halla, to our next council meeting to provide some information on the idea. Council members responded that they were open to getting information and so I invited Mark to attend our meeting.

I met and talked with Assistant to the Bishop, Craig Pederson, at the recent Minneapolis Synod Ministerium. Craig sent a link from the Synod website regarding the call process that I forwarded to all our council members. He also indicated he would be happy to follow up in person with us.

I continue my regular weekly and monthly duties of planning and preparing for teaching and worship opportunities, visiting people at home and in the hospital with communion, coordinating with staff and volunteers in a variety of ways, providing communication and correspondence to teams, council, volunteers and the congregation, working with families in preparation for

baptisms, weddings and funerals, and being involved in the community with other clergy and community leaders.

The annual Synod Assembly is coming up on the final weekend of this month and I will be attending, along with the other members of our congregation who volunteered at our last annual meeting to represent our church.

Staff Reports:

Custodial:

Curt reported that remote controls for thermostats will be replaced when the new furnaces come in. Leaks in the sprinkler system are scheduled to be fixed. He reported that the lawn mowing service will possibly be covered. Curt will be removing the trailer with the aluminum cans and we will no longer be accepting recycled cans. The box that covered the vent system disintegrated and he covered up the hole. Curt reported that the grass on the side of Church will need new sod and that he will also be removing the shrubs in the front of the Church. He also reported that the old light bulbs and electronics will be taken to Scott County recycling center.

Treasurer:

Rae walked through the monthly and quarterly reports and stated that the month of March was down and we missed our budget for offerings. She reported that we received an estate check at the end of March and put it in the general fund account.

Rae noted that the 5% of interest of Larry Kiewel life insurance policy was moved to the general fund. She also reported that the foundation committee will be meeting with Ashton Pankonin, with KMF Advisors, to discuss options for the foundation fund.
