From Pastor Ted

As you receive this, we have just completed our Confirmation Sunday. We confirmed 24 ninth grade students on Sunday, October 29th. It is a real pleasure to see these young people make public profession of their faith. A tremendous amount of work goes into confirmation – not just for students. Adults have been guiding these young people for years through Sunday School, Connect and Confirmation. I want to say a big "THANK YOU" to all the adults that helped in the process. It is way that you have lived out your Christian faith and influenced other lives. It may not always have seemed like it was working, but you have helped lay a foundation of faith to build their lives upon. You make St. John's ministry go!

Last month I told you about my normal weekly routine. I expect to be in Belle Plaine for Sunday worship and Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Since then, I met with someone who has helped out at St. John in the past, Diana Hunstad. Diana is willing to serve if there needs to be a funeral on Thursday, Friday or Saturday. I would really like to be able to lead all the funeral services, but I realize that because I live such a distance from Belle Plaine that may not be possible. So, if you need to hold a funeral on those days, Diana is willing to lead the service. I want to remind you of our Thanksgiving Service on Monday, November 20, at Our Lady of the Prairie Catholic Church. We will not have our own Thanksgiving service, so this is an opportunity to pause with the people of Belle Plaine to say thank-you to God for all the blessings of the past year. If you are not able to join us that night, I encourage you to be deliberate of being thankful. Take time. Be intentional to reflect on the many blessings God has brought to your life and then to say thank you. It is so easy to just take the blessings for granted and then wonder where God is at when we face challenges or trials. Social science research and the field of psychology tell us that "being thankful" really does make a difference in how we experience life. Thankfulness increases our level of happiness – no kidding. There are lots of studies on it. Just google "psychology of happiness", do some reading and you will find all sorts of information on how practicing gratitude affects our happiness. Anyway, it is November – take time to thank God for all the good in your life.

Notice elsewhere in the newsletter that I am offering some appointment times to talk about transition at St. John. But if you want to talk with me about other things — please call the office and go to my office phone. My cell phone number is on my phone recording. If you have a pastoral care emergency, please call. I generally don't share my cell number in writing because computer robots will pick it up and start calling and texting me. Please, call if you want to talk.

Opening Devotions:

Pastor Ted opened up with a request for the council to repeat verse John 3:16 out loud with him and to keep it as a reminder as this month he wants to change the focus on transition to what we are really all about. Pastor Ted said a prayer.

Approval of Minutes:

Members of Council reviewed the minutes from the September 11, 2023 Council Meeting. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the meeting minutes from September. A request to change item B under New Business - Mission Trip to be moved to number V - after Approval of minutes on the agenda. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the change and agenda for October 9th. 2023.

Pastor Ted Report:

Pastor Ted reported that they have launched confirmation on Wednesday nights and is going well. 9th graders will be confirmed on October 29th. He mentioned he has made some slight changes to Sunday morning worship and everything seems to be going well. On Pastoral Care, he has visited the care facilities and has also had a funeral and everything went well.

Ted mentioned that he would like to get the Church committees up and running. After fall break he is going to interview people from the congregation and bring his report to the council.

Staff Reports:

A motion was made, seconded and carried to ask the church staff to submit short written reports for six months and the council will evaluate the value of the reports.

Custodial:

Tim Moonen reported to the council the following items:

- Heating units are installed and complete. First maintenance for all the heating units have been scheduled.
- Found someone for snow removal.
- A new water heater has been installed.
- Received an estimate for the entrance sign.
- \bullet $\;\;$ Looking at replacing the fridge in the kitchen.
- Working on switching the clocks to digital clocks.

Tim brought to the council the request for the nick nacks in the kitchen to be removed.

Treasurer:

Jerold reported the monthly and quarterly reports and answered questions from Council members. He mentioned confirmation revenue is down for this year. Expenses were a little high this month which was to be expected due to two pastors for a short period. Jerold has started working on the budget for next year to present to the council next month.

Transfers:

No Transfers in or out this month.

Ongoing Business:

- A. Church Roll Update
 - a. Scheduling a meeting with Pastor Ted to discuss creating a Membership status letter.
- B. Job Description
 - a. Wendy Thies discussed with the council, on behalf of the Personnel committee, that the Personnel committee is currently working on the reviews for the staff members and have a date set for October 25th. The Personnel committee is

asking for input from the council on what the staff job descriptions should look like.

C. Venmo Account

a. Jerold received confirmation that the church can not open a Venmo account without a cell phone number. He brought the question to the council if we should purchase a tracfone in order to open an account. Jerold is going to research more information on requirements from Venmo and cost on the tracfone and bring the information to the council meeting next month.

New Business:

- A. Ben followed up with Lainey Schwartz regarding the use of the gathering space for a workout class. He provided Lainey with the requirements for the use of the gathering area.
- B. Mission Trip update
 - a. Molly Moonen attended the council meeting to discuss the 2024 Mission Trip. Kirk and Molly are in the works of organizing a High School Mission Trip going to Benton Harbor, Michigan July 7-12th. More information will be sent out. They are asking for \$5,000.00 from the Jr/Sr. High youth fund plus additional funds if needed to help pay for the transportation rental and meals for the ride there and back. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the funds for the mission trip.
 - b. A discussion was held regarding the purchasing of script cards and the high inventory volume. A motion was made, second and carried to suspend script card purchases until the council determines a max inventory allowance on script cards. A motion was made, second and carried to tabled this motion until next month's meeting until further discussion regarding the purchasing of script cards.
- C. A discussion was held regarding the option to eliminate offering plates on Sunday or to keep them. The council has agreed to keep the offering plates as is.
- D. A discussion was held regarding eliminating the library in the gathering area wondering if we can get rid of the books and the shelves. Tabled to discuss at the next meeting.
- E. A discussion was held regarding Christmas worship. Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday so he mentioned that we should focus on Christmas Eve worship in the afternoon and evening only.
