

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Unapproved St. John Lutheran Church Council Minutes

February 10, 2025

President Jim Eggers called the meeting to order at 6:38 p.m.

Approval of Minutes:

Members of Council reviewed the minutes from January 13th, 2025 Council Meeting. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the meeting minutes. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the current agenda with new business items E-K added for February 10th, 2025.

Pastor Ted Report:

A. Vacation – nothing to report

Staff Reports:

A. Amanda's office report was reviewed by members of the council.

Treasurer's Reports:

A. Jerold's treasurer report was reviewed by the council. Overall, January ended favorable to budget with higher offering revenues and expenses came in below budget due to the unknown cost for confirmation. Jerold also talked with the congregation about Vanco, the online giving option, and its ease of use.

Transfers:

A. The council approved 5 new members: Jessica Nagel, Dave and Carla Friest, and Pete and Catherine Bendzick

Ongoing Business:

- A. Call Committee Update: The call committee is getting the "pre-work" done, including interview questions. They are hoping to begin reviewing candidates in early March. The synod has recommended that we keep the parsonage to include as part of our Ministry Site Profile (MSP). Members of the council recalled the previous decision was not to include the parsonage in the MSP due to the condition of the home and the funds that would be required to prepare the home for a new pastor.
- B. Property Task Force: The council reviewed the plans for the sale of property and the parking lot with representatives from the property task force.
- C. A Congregational Meeting will be held on February 16th to discuss the sale of the parsonage and the parking lot proposal. Members of the congregation will vote via ballot.
- D. An All Committee meeting will be held on Wednesday, April 23rd at 7pm in the Youth Room. The purpose of the meeting will be to have all committees together to discuss topics that touch multiple groups.

New Business:

- A. The council accepted the resignation of Cayla Menke. Per the constitution, the council should appoint a new council member. Council members will seek other candidates to fill a 1 year term and will discuss at the March council meeting.
- B. Kallie Thaemert was nominated as the Youth Delegate for the Convention in May though she is unavailable on Friday, May 2nd. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve Kallie as the youth delegate.
- C. The council discussed a creation of a Welcome Committee. This discussion was tabled until the March meeting.
- D. The council discussed the creation of a Finance Committee. The purpose of this committee would be manage the finances of the church including financial planning and budgeting. Jerold Stauffacher will work to recruit members for this committee.
- E. After discussion of the pew pads, motion was made, seconded and carried to approve putting pew pads back in the church to have more visibility to visitors and communing members.
- F. Council discussed the use of name tags; it was decided that members with name tags may take their name tags but wearing a name tags while worshipping will not be required.
- G. The council discussed Pastor Teds retirement and the bridge or temporary pastor until a permanent replacement is found. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve to move to a single 9am service beginning on Sunday, May 11th. Wednesday evening services at 6pm will continue.
- H. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve a \$100 donation from the youth fund for Dollars for Scholars.
- I. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve a \$100 gift basket donation from the youth fund to BPHS Post Prom.
- J. The council declined a request for donation from Strengthening Individual Families and Communities, an organization in Sioux Falls, SD.
- K. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the transportation and meals during travel for the mission trip. Estimated expense will be no more than \$5,000.

Ministry Team Updates:

- A. The music and worship committee had no new updates from January's annual meeting.
- B. The Building and Grounds Committee worked to fix the compressor for the sprinkler system.

Motion was made, seconded, and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:26 p.m. Meeting was adjourned followed by the Lord's prayer.

From Pastor Ted:

By the time you read this, Lent will be just a few days away. Ash Wednesday is March 5th and is one of the favorite traditions at St John. We call Lent a season of preparation, which leads up to our Easter celebration. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts for 40 days (Sundays are not counted). Lent ends on the Saturday before Easter. The 40 days are a reminder to us of the 40 years the Israelites wandered in the Wilderness and the 40 days that Jesus fasted and was tempted in the dessert. Our preparation involves self-reflection and self-examination. The tradition of "giving something up for Lent" points back to all that Jesus resisted and the food that Jesus "gave up" during his time in the dessert. Lent is sometimes called a season of repentance. It is a time to look at our lives and to identify those things that need changing. Sundays are not included in the 40 days of Lent because Sundays are always a celebration of our Lord's resurrection.

Easter comes very late this year, April 20th . Christmas is always December 25th but Easter moves each year. The date for Easter is always the first Sunday following the first full moon of the Spring Equinox (March 21). Easter can be as early as March 22 or as late as April 25.

So, now we know what Lent and Easter is all about, right! Well, not exactly. The date of Ash Wednesday is mostly inconsequential. The exact Sunday Easter falls on really doesn't matter to the meaning of Easter. What really matters about Easter is that,

"You have been saved by grace through faith and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as result of works, that no one should boast." Ephesians 2: 8, 9

Easter is really about a savior! There is only one who can wash away our sins. There is only one who died on the cross for you and me. There is only one who can forgive us in heaven's records. There is only one. With the savior, there is no more striving on my own to find God's favor. No more attempts to make myself good enough for God. No more games making other people think I am religious. No more trying to be religious. No more running. No more hiding. No more faking it. We don't have to, we have a savior!

We have been forgiven in Christ. What Christ, the savior, has done is enough. His death is our death. His descent into hell is our ultimate alienation from God. His resurrection is our resurrection. Jesus has done for us that which we could not do for ourselves. By the grace of God we are made righteous. Because of God's love we are no longer alienated from God but friends. In baptism the promise of the savior comes to us in the water; "You are Mine". In communion the promise of the savior comes in the bread and wine; "I am yours." So, plan on attending the Wednesday Lenten services. Come and hear about "Faith In My Life" as shared by members of St John. Take time to worship Him. Take time to thank the savoir who has saved you.

You may or may not know:

Last month was hoppin! We got to know the youth ministry team a little better, as well as the facilities and grounds/technology team. The quilters of the church started the beloved Senior quilts, we welcomed a new member through baptism and we started to prepare for Lent. Which means soup and sandwich suppers are starting! Join us starting at 5:30pm every Wednesday for food and fellowship, followed by the Holden Prayer service at 6:30pm. We have a great arrangement of speakers this Lent and I don't think you'll want to miss it!

And as we March into spring, let us use this season to renew our Faith, reconnect through worship and refresh our spirit of giving. Let us also pray for the Church Council, all our amazing Ministry teams, and the call committee as we look ahead and call for a new Pastor.

Sue might not have realized when she was hired on as an evening shift CNA back in 1985 that it would lead to a career lasting 35 years and counting. "The Lutheran Home was a prime employer and I considered myself lucky and part of the elite when I was finally hired," Sue recalls. "In order to get my foot in the door I knew I needed to be persistent. And it paid off." Having small children at home made it a challenge for Sue to work the evening and graveyard shifts. However, she found a way to make it work and has taken on many different titles and roles over the years. Sue was quickly recognized for her advocacy and passion for the residents and the staff.

During her time as a CNA, she was asked to join the *Residents and Coworkers Recruitment and Retention Committee.* She travelled to some of the satellite locations within TLHA and met with other leaders to help build a program that helped reduce overall employee turnover. Other responsibilities along the way included becoming a *Restorative Program Aid*, a *Preceptor*, and a *Neighborhood Coordinator*. These jobs were always related to being able to work directly with residents and staff, and Sue became well known as a go-to resource.

In 2018, Sue left the CNA field and became the *Office Coordinator* Kingsway Senior Living. During this time she went back to school and in 2022 was able to bring to fruition her dream job of becoming a *Nurse Administrative Assistant*, and continues in that role at Kingsway today.
