

From Pastor Mark

November brings thoughts of Thanksgiving...and Thanksgiving brings to my mind that great old hymn, "Now Thank We All Our God." There is an interesting story about this hymn from the book "Amazing Grace," by Kenneth Osbeck that I think you might appreciate:

"From some of the severest human suffering imaginable during the 30 Years War of 1618-48 – a war that was long and extremely devastating in its effects – this great hymn of the church was born.

Martin Rinkart (1586 – 1649) was called at the age of 31 to pastor the state Lutheran church in his native city of Eilenberg, Germany. He arrived there just as the dreadful bloodshed of the 30 Years War began and it was there that Rinkart spent the remaining 32 years of his life faithfully ministering to these troubled people.

Germany, the battleground of this conflict between warring Catholic and Protestant forces from various countries throughout Europe, was reduced to a state of misery that baffles description. The German population dwindled from 16 million to 6 million. Because Eilenberg was a walled city, it became a frightfully over-crowded refuge for political and military fugitives from far and near. Throughout these war years several waves of deadly diseases and famines swept the city, as the various armies marched through the town, leaving death and destruction in their wake. The plague of 1637 was particularly severe. At its height Rinkart was the only minister remaining to care for the sick and dying.

Martin Rinkart's triumphant, personal expressions of gratitude and confidence in God confirm for each of us this truth taught in Scripture, that as God's children, we too can be, as St. Paul writes in the eighth chapter of Romans, "more than conqueror's through Him who loved us." Infused with this confident hope, amidst all of the harsh brutality of the times in which he was living, Martin Rinkart sat down and put pen to paper and wrote the text of words, later to set to music by Johann Cruger (1598 – 1662), that would become one of our most familiar and beloved hymns of gratitude and thanksgiving for all of the abundant blessings of God:

"Now thank we all our God – with hearts and hands and voices – Who wondrous things has done – in whom his world rejoices; Who from our mother's arms – has blest us on our way – With countless gifts of love – and still is ours today. O may this bounteous God – through all our lives be near us – With every joyful hearts – and blessed peace to cheer us – And keep us in his grace – and guide us when perplexed – And free us from all harm – in this world and the next. All praise and thanks to God – the Father now be given – The Son and Him who reigns – With them in highest heaven – The one eternal God – Whom earth and heaven adore – For thus it was, is now – and shall be evermore."

I think this is a truly remarkable story. It shows that even in the midst of really dire and devastating circumstances the gift of faith can still look out and find the sustaining hand of God through it all. That, in itself, is worthy of thanksgiving. So thanks be to God for people such Martin Rinkart who embody such a life giving faith. May we all be strengthened and encouraged by it. And may you know the joy and strength, the solace and companionship, the generosity and compassion of Christ and of his abiding presence with you through all that life will bring.
