Approval of Minutes:

Council reviewed the minutes of the October 14th , 2025 Council Meeting. Motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the meeting minutes.

The council reviewed the current agenda; a motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the agenda.

Staff Report:

A. Amanda's office report was reviewed by members of the council. In addition to the day to day tasks, Amanda is working on the next steps for the church directory and continues to keep Connect and Confirmation running smoothly for all of the kids and leaders!

B. Pastor Sherri's report was reviewed by the council. Pastor has been very busy presiding at services, planning music, and teaching connect and confirmation. She is active outside of the 4 walls of St. John by meeting with other clergy in the community, making home visits and presiding at Kingsway. She is also hosting a bible study, has started a Care Team, and started a youth choir! If you know anyone that would like to join the care team or youth choir, please reach out to Pastor for more information. Lastly, Pastor shared the "reforming ideas" from Reformation Sunday with the council and council discussed the list and will pick a few common themes to work on throughout the coming months.

Treasurer's Report:

Jerold's treasurer report was reviewed by the council. For the month of October, we hit the budgeted Monthly offerings. We were over the budgeted amount by \$1,158 so that is a step in the right direction. We are a little behind the Budgeted amount for the year \$10,349. Compared to actual expenses for the year we are operating in the black this year. Expenses for the month were a little under budget (\$835), for the year are below our budgeted expenses but are spending a little over \$2000 more than we did to this same point last year.

Balances in accounts as of November 5th are as follows:

- a. Ameriprise Account (Stier) balance: \$119,112
- b. Property Improvement (Savings) balance: \$55,255 (plus \$101,985 & amp; \$75,000 CD)
- c. Technology Fund balance: \$1,432
- d. Foundation Account (Interest from Foundation Investment) balance: \$22,657
- e. General Fund balance: \$13,595f. Youth Account balance: \$21,298
- g. Building Fund Checkbook balance: \$7,400
- h. Memorial Fund balance: \$19,658
- i. Jackson Account (Larry Kiewel) balance: \$72,706
- j. St. John Foundation Investment balance: \$192,504
- B. The Council also did a Preliminary review of the 2026 Annual Budget. We'll continue to review and refine over the next month.

Transfers:

A. No transfers in or out this month.

Ongoing Business:

- A. An All Committee meeting was held on October 27th.
- B. St. John received a generous donation of \$3000 from the family of John Woestehoff. The council has decided to spread this generosity by donating \$1000 to the Belle Plaine Food Shelf, \$1000 to Operation Christmas Child with any unused funds going to Belle Plaine Police Departments Toys for Tots. The remaining \$1000 will be added to the general fund to help in covering expenses here at St. John.
- C. The Personnel Committee has completed the employee handbook. Due to its length, members of the council have received electronic copies to review individually. We will discuss as a council during Decembers Council meeting.

New Business:

A. No new business

Ministry Team Updates:

- A. The council reviewed the Worship and Music Committee Report. They added some beautiful touches during services for All Saints Day and Veterans Day and will continue to work with Pastor and Eileen on music. Watch for details on a "Hope in the Darkness" service on Sunday, December 21st.
- B. The council reviewed the Nomination Committees Report. They are hard at work to find nominees for the positions that will need to be filled in January. We appreciate those that have already agreed to their call to serve in these positions at St. John.

Motion was made, seconded, and carried to adjourn the meeting at 8:12p.m.

Finding Hope in Jesus

As I was watching the Vikings game yesterday, I couldn't help but marvel at how many people were packed into the stadium. In my humble opinion, our team wasn't playing very well, and before long I found myself getting bored—glancing down at my iPad, wondering whether Emily and I should go shopping or what chores I ought to tackle at home. Then a strange thought came to me: If the baby Jesus were born right in the middle of the field, would people stay and watch him grow, watch what plays he would make, watch how he treated the other players or would they eventually get bored and head home?

These questions were still in my head as I went to sleep and I began to imagine if Jesus was there, would we have set off fireworks for him or have a great half-time show, have a special cheer for him or play music in honor of him. Would the crowds have stared silently at this miraculous child? Or would they cheer and shout and sing songs of joy? Would hope fill their hearts with a sense of wonder and awe?

Some weird thoughts and questions, I know. But sometimes, as a pastor, you go to that place and try to see Jesus in a crowded stadium, a busy mall, a full gymnasium or a congested freeway. You look for places that most people would never think that Jesus would be. A homeless shelter, a jail cell and a park bench where there is heat coming through a city street vent to keep them warm.

It is my belief that in every one of those places, in every one of those hearts, there is a feeling of hope. Hope in what is to come next, hope in the things that can change, hope in a better way and a better life.

Hope...a very powerful word and one that is found at the heart of Jesus.

We are in the season of Advent...a time where we wait for Jesus. It's a story for Christians that has been told a thousand times over and one that I never get tired of. For it is this child that I find my hope...my hope to be a better person, to live a better life, to be a better neighbor to those I know and to those I will meet. To know that things will get better, even when the road is long and rough. To know that I am never truly lost, because Jesus has shown me the way. To know that I am not alone, even when I feel forgotten.

For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given...And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
